## To make your play dough you'll need:

- 1 cup flour
- $1 / 2$ cup salt
- 1/2 cup warm water
- Food coloring or washable paint (optional)

Mix together flour and salt in a large bowl.
Slowly stir in warm water while mixing dry ingredients.
As dough begins to form, mixture will be harder to stir. Try using your hands to knead the dough! It will be sticky, but remember we can wash our hands after.

If desired, divide your dough into equal parts to add color. If using food coloring, you may want to wear gloves. If your hands do get stained, they will usually wash clean within 24 hours.

Play dough will store in refrigerator for up to 4 weeks!

## Cardboard Tube Sculpture

## To make your cardboard tube construction set you'll need:

- Cardboard tubes
- Scissors
- A ruler
- Paint and brushes (optional)

Start by cutting the tubes into smaller pieces. We cut some of the tubes into pieces 5 cms long, and some into pieces 10 cms long. Try to be as accurate as you can when cutting the pieces, but don't worry too much.

Next you need to cut small slots into the top and bottom of each tube


Use a ruler to make approximate marks on all four side of the tube and cut a narrow slot at each mark. Then turn it over and do the same on the bottom. The slots don't need to be very wide, just the width of the cardboard, and again, it doesn't matter too much if you are not perfect.

Now you can see how the pieces will slot together.
You can leave the tubes plain and just build with them as they are, or you can add some color!


## Frida Kahlo Self Portrait



To create a self-portrait like this, you need a camera and a printer.

Take a "selfie" or let a helper photograph you. Say CHEESE!!

Print off your selfie and add color using crayons or colored pencils. Choose your colors carefully!

Cut out your portrait and glue it onto a clean piece of paper. Choose your favorite color to color in the background

Frida Kahlo liked to surround her portrait with animals and flowers that she liked. What do you like? Draw some items around your portrait OR look through some magazines to cut out pictures of things you like and glue them to your paper.


To create a self-portrait like this, start by drawing a large OVAL or CIRCLE for your head. (Or you can use the template provided) To add a face, draw 2 eyes, a nose, and a mouth. Don't forget your eyebrows!

Draw in your hair. Is your hair long or short?
Now add a neck and shoulders. We don't want your head to float away!

Frida Kahlo liked to surround her portrait with animals and flowers that she liked. What do you like? Draw some items around your portrait.

Now it is time to add COLOR. Remember to choose your colors carefully and try to color neatly!
